PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the DISTRICT COURT, RAMSEY COUNTY, ST. PAUL, MINN.

The petition of Albert Isak Rosenthal hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First, the place of residence is 546 St. Paul Street, St. Paul, Minn. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second, My occupation is Merchant

Third, I was born on the 15 day of Sept., anno Domini 1890, at Prestwich, Poland

Fourth, I emigrated to the United States from Poland, on or about the 20 day of Nov., anno Domini 1902, and arrived in the United States, at the port of St. Paul, on the 5 day of Dec., anno Domini 1902, on the vessel Polonia (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or means of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth, I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 28 day of Nov., anno Domini 1903, in the DISTRICT COURT, RAMSEY COUNTY, ST. PAUL, MINN.

Sixth, I am married. My wife's name is Hanna (she) was born on the 30 day of Aug., anno Domini 1890, at Poland, and now resides at St. Paul, Minn. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I have 3 children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh, I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Republic of Poland of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth, I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth, I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 5 day of Nov., anno Domini 1902, and in the State of Minnesota continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 15 day of Sept., anno Domini 1904, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth, I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the St. Paul Court of St. Paul at St. Paul, on the 15 day of Nov., anno Domini 1904, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

Declaration of Intention No. 15928 and Certificate of Arrival from Department of Labor filed this 15 day of March, 1923.
